### Confirmation

Bishop Stevenson will make his first official visit to Saint Martins on November 10<sup>th</sup>! He will be confirming those who have been baptized but did not receive the laying on of hands at their baptism. Our Book of Common Prayer states the following about confirmation:



"In the course of their Christian development, those baptized at an early age are expected, when they are ready and have been duly prepared, to make a mature public affirmation of their faith and commitment to the responsibilities of their Baptism and to receive the laying on of hands by the bishop.

Those baptized as adults, unless baptized with laying on of hands by a bishop, are also expected to make a public affirmation of their faith and commitment to the responsibilities of their Baptism in the presence of a bishop and to receive the laying on of hands."

I ask that you make every effort to be here on the 10<sup>th</sup> to welcome Our New Bishop and to celebrate with those who are to be confirmed their renewed commitment to their faith in Christ. Bishop Stevenson will host a forum following the service to answer any question you have about our diocese

# Words from Rev. Dr. Sandra Levy-Mix

### "Writing Your Own Obituary"

Last September there appeared in the *New York Times* Opinion section a think piece by Kelly McMasters titled "Why I Write my Obituary Every Year." (September 29, 2024; See lead photo) Now I found that title eye-catching and provocative, and so I read further. Actually McMasters had been writing her obit every year since she was twelve years old. Turns out her mother was given that assignment as part of her training as a hospice volunteer, and the young McMasters decided to follow suit in a journal that she was keeping at the time.

Now I had read about this spiritual practice in years past. Even though most folks don't like to dwell on death in any case, and certainly not their own—I think you can see that the practice might make sense. Such a spiritual practice enables you to take a long view of your life. Of your accomplishments, of your life as a whole, how you would like to be remembered by others, what you are most proud of in the long run.

In fact, there is a formula—an outline of sorts—that funeral homes and newspapers tend to follow when writing or accepting obit information submitted by or to them. The facts—age at the time of death, sometimes cause of death, survivors, achievements in work or school, and finally what the community or others will remember about the person's life. I and perhaps you have had experience in writing obits for family or former spouses—drawing on memory and other written documents lovingly preserved.



In Nicholas Kristof's memoir *Chasing Hope*, which I wrote about in a recent blog, he sites David Brook's distinction between "resume virtues" and "eulogy virtues." The former, "resume virtues" are actually the achievements you have won over a lifetime. For me—if you will permit me—I guess an example of that would be winning a top award from the American Psychological Association for my Ph.D. dissertation research and published work on schizophrenia and symptom expression.

Brook's "eulogy virtues" are the deeper qualities for which a person is missed when they are gone. They reflect the purpose-driven and deep meaning that your whole life has represented. For me of course this is reflected in my church life—my love of preaching and the attempt to foster deeper faith in those I have led as both Rector and Associate Rector in my current life.

McMasters ends her opinion piece thus:

I'm grateful my mother brought the practice of looking at death this way to the dinner table all those decades ago and continued to do so through all the stories of her dying patients after that. Just as my aunt taught me the value of keeping a journal, my mother's obituary exercise taught me the practice and value of holding death close, so I could remember to live.

Well I think this all makes a great deal of sense. Maybe we should all try to write our own obit as part of our new year's resolution and periodic life review.





Each meeting always ends with a Eucharist Service. This was also special in this about 260 year building with so much history.





# **November: Giving Thanks**

As we approach the holiday season, thanksgiving, and even as we look back on the year, we can find so many things to be thankful for. In a year when there is so much turmoil: disastrous hurricanes in the east, wildfires in the west and so much tragedy. It seems like there is nothing but bad news. While we are thankful for all God has blessed us with, for others it may invoke sadness or anxiety. Let us remember to pray for those who are not so fortunate, doing whatever we can to help.

Did you know that counting your blessings can increase your emotional health and is associated with greater happiness? Gratitude helps people feel more positive, emotions deal with adversity and build strong relationships. The following are documented benefits of giving thanks.



Researchers have studied 3 groups of students: one group listed what they were grateful for, the other listed what they were angry about, and the third made random lists. The group who listed what they were grateful for was the happiest at the end of the experiment. What was even more interesting was that the students who expressed gratitude were less likely to be sick throughout

the semester. "Thanks be to God for his inexpressible gifts, 2 Corinthians 9:15"

2. Being grateful increases your blessings. We take for granted the blue skies, the beautiful sunset, the flowers, and the bountiful harvest. The more we notice all the beauty of nature and give thanks for all we enjoy, including our freedom, the more blessed we seem to be! "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to the Father through him" Colossians 3:17

- 3. The consequences of not being grateful. "And when the people complained, it displeased the Lord: and the Lord heard it" Numbers 11:1. People who are not grateful tend to complain, mostly about anything or everything! We can make that choice to have a grateful heart (an attitude of gratitude). Think of the benefits!
- 4. Gratitude keeps us continually aware that the Lord is close by. It motivates us to look for His purpose in our circumstances. Thanking God focuses our attention on Him rather than our circumstances.
- 5. Thankfulness is an essential ingredient for joy. Gratitude transforms anxiety into peace, which passes all understanding. "Be fearful for nothing, but in everything

with prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God which passes all understanding will keep your heart and mind through Jesus Christ our Lord. Philippians 4:6-7"
